Dr. Foltz has a joint research and extension appointment and is the Director of the Program on Agricultural Technology Studies at UW-Madison. His extension work grows out of the research he does on alternative technologies, producing numerous factsheets and extension presentations for extension audiences on topics ranging from farm finance to how to value new alternative technologies. Dr. Foltz has worked as a consultant for USAID, the World Bank, and served as a Peace Corps volunteer in Mali. In addition he is a recipient of two Fulbright fellowships (1995 for work on technology adoption in Tunisia and 2008 for work on the economics of new rice varieties in Mali). Dr. Foltz has current funding from USAID for joint work with IER-Mali researcher NTji Coulibaly to work on maize-jatropha intercropping for biofuel production.
